HYMN NOTES

O God of Earth and Space was written in 1980 by Jane Parker Huber (d. 2008). The text praises God for all the gifts provided in creation. Huber says, “God's care is also a providence that extends beyond material things into the realm of the spirit, where God has just as wonderfully provided music, thought, art, faithfulness, love, and justice.” *Let Us Talents and Tongues Employ* is a lively “Communion Calypso,” according to Fred Kaan, the author of the text. The Jamaican folk melody was brought to Kaan by a neighbor, who requested him to write a text for Communion to the tune. It was sung at the World Council of Churches Nairobi Assembly in 1975. We will repeat the last line of the refrain as most hymnals do.

TODAY’S MUSIC

Pietro Yon was born in Italy in 1886. He served as organist at St. Peter’s in Rome and then emigrated to America in 1907. In New York City he served as organist at St. Francis Xavier and then St. Patrick’s Cathedral. He was esteemed as a recitalist, as teacher, and as the composer of numerous works for the church, the most popular of which was *Jesu Bambino*. He died in 1943. Pietro Yon taught Robert Elmore, who taught Weldon Adams. Today we will hear two of his compositions.
